

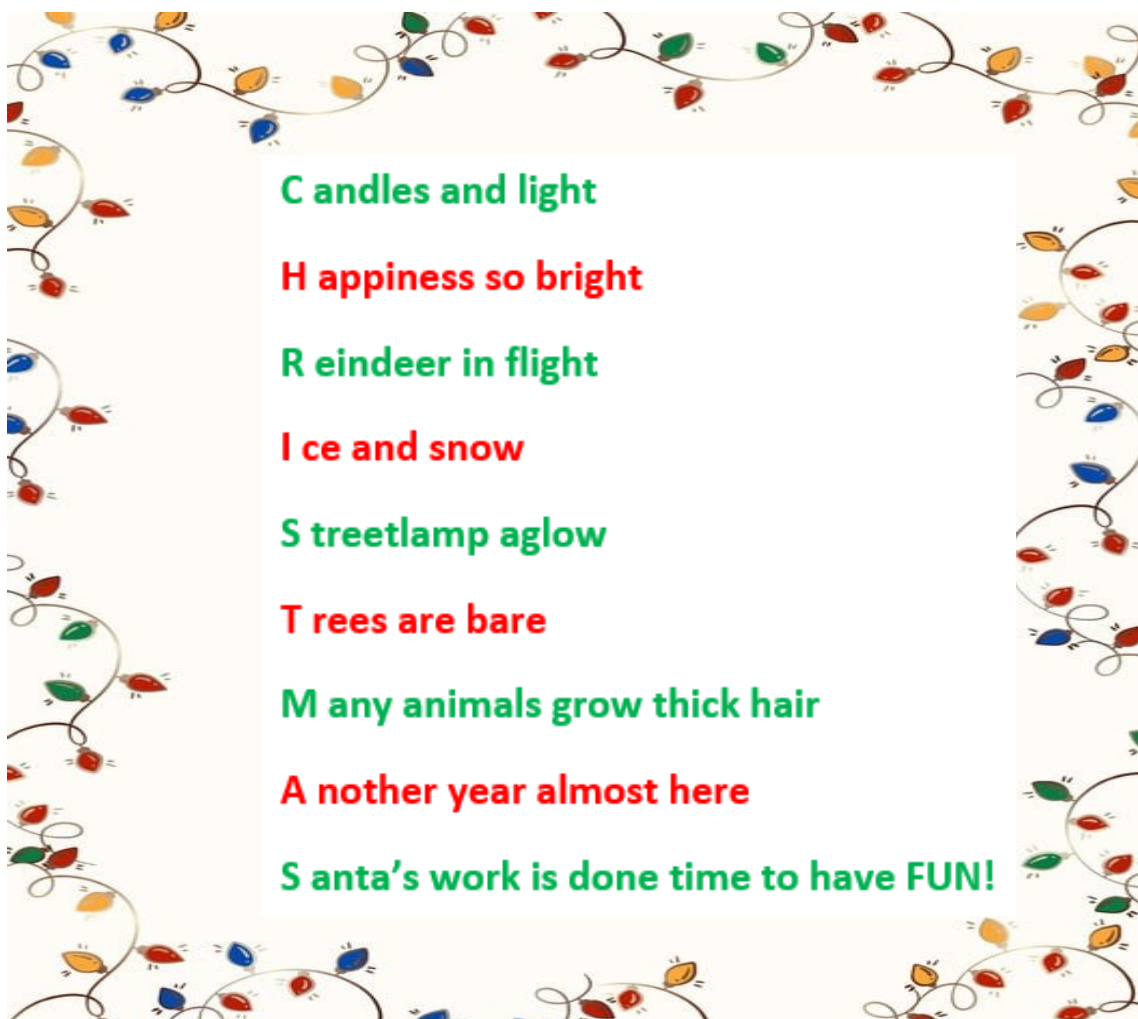

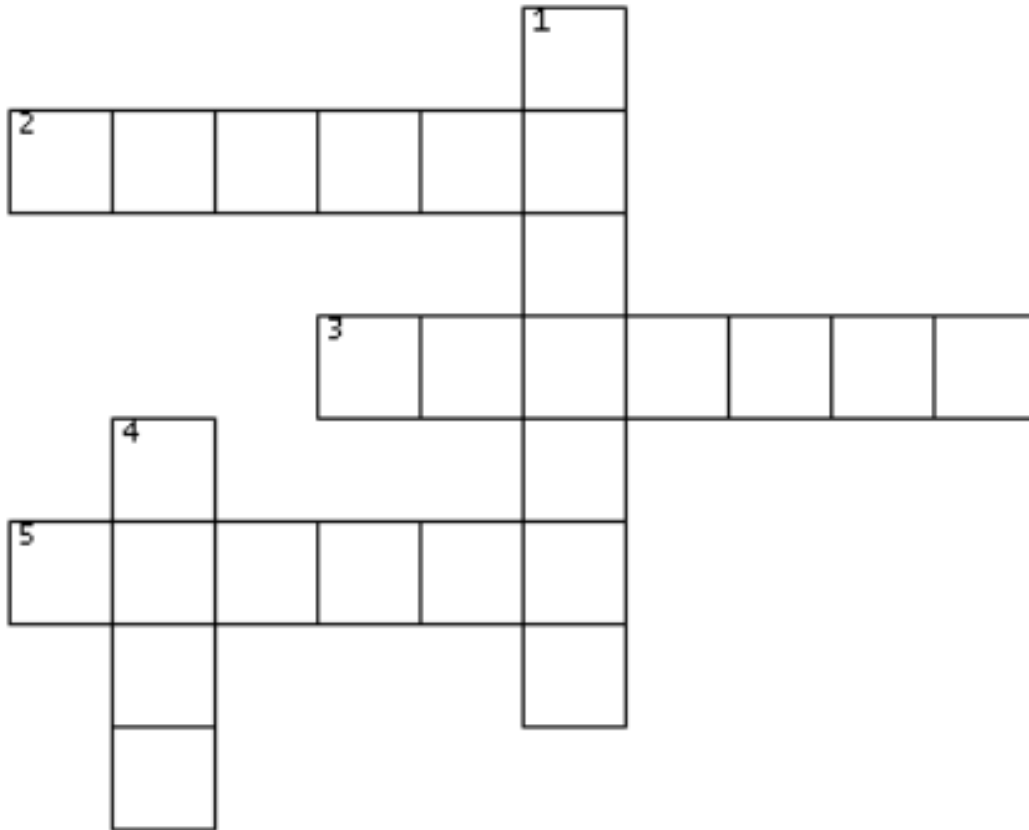


Christmas acrostic poem by Geo Ingram Year 5

Our current artist to help inspire us is David Wiseman. He was born on September 11th 1981 in California, USA.

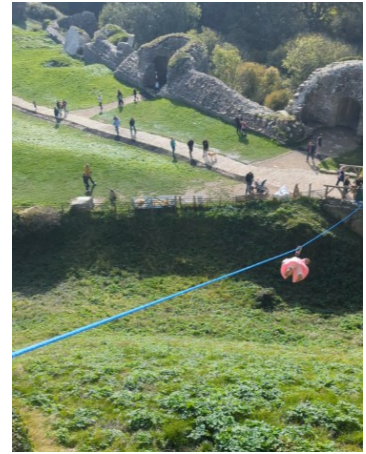
What inspires David's art? He was fascinated with the natural world. This included global decorative art traditions and a passion for using timeless craft techniques.

One sunny autumn day in October, Mia decided to have a big day out. She wanted to go on an enormous zipwire.

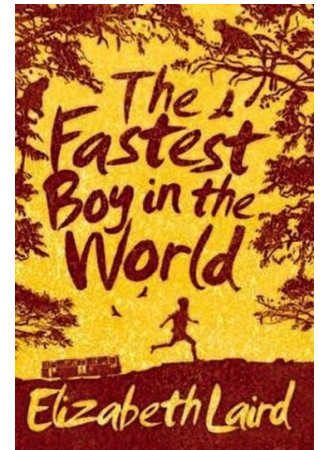

Summary:

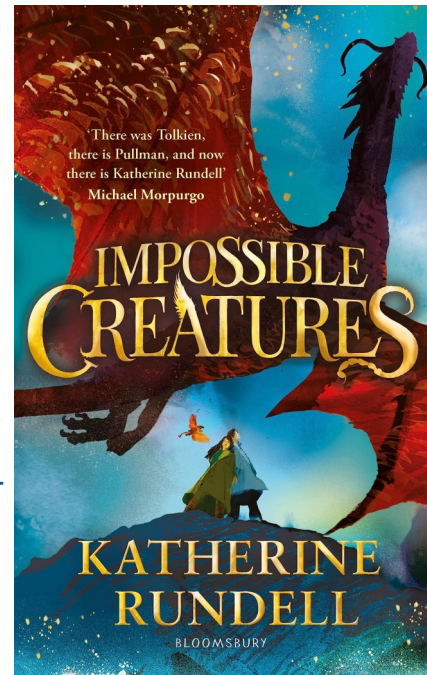
